Understanding green jobs





Green jobs are characterised by an "activity that directly contributes to, or indirectly supports, the achievement of the UK's net zero emissions target and helps mitigate climate risks." *

In simpler terms, they are jobs that contribute to tackling climate change and preserving or restoring the natural environment.


Types of green jobs

Green jobs exist across all skill levels, from entry level jobs requiring minimal training or prior experience (such as working in a second-hand shop) to highly specialized ones like a heat pump technician or environmental lawyer.

As all sectors of the economy decarbonise and work to reduce their environmental impacts, all jobs will have a green element.



Transferrable skills

Skills that can be applied across a wide range of jobs. These are generally learnt throughout the course of your career.



Green skills can be thought of as green knowledge or behaviours. They include transferable skills and technical knowledge.

Think about what skills you already have and those you might want to develop. What have people said you you are naturally good at? What would you like to dedicate time to learning?





Technical knowledge

More specialised and specific knowledge and skills required for certain tasks or jobs. These are often learnt through formal study and training but can also in some cases be learnt through work.



Environmental policy is about how laws and government decisions are used to tackle environmental problems.


What it involves:

Designing or advising on laws & regulations

Researching solutions to climate & nature challenges

Making sure decisions are fair & based on evidence

** Typical day for a policy adviser includes tasks like researching, writing & influencing



Working in policy at a think tank

Thinktanks are organisations that research issues and develop policy ideas, to try and influence government decisions.

Early career routes

- Internships at think tanks (from summer placements to full-year roles)
- Graduate programmes (e.g. Civil Service Fast Stream, Green Alliance traineeship)
- Entry-level roles (e.g. comms, operations, policy or politics assistant)

Career switchers

Many careers build skills that transfer easily into policy work, such as:

- Journalism: research, clear writing, explaining complex issues
- Law: policy analysis, working with regulation, building arguments
- Academia/research: evidence gathering, critical thinking
